

# Cybersecurity Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP) Workshop for Municipalities in New Hampshire

## 90-Minute Agenda

### Purpose:

This workshop aims to help New Hampshire counties, municipalities, and schools understand how to maintain essential operations during a cybersecurity incident. Participants will learn practical strategies for building resilience through proactive planning. By the end of the session, they will be ready to start developing a customized Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP) for each department in their organization.

### Audience:

Municipal leaders, decision-makers, department heads, chiefs, and staff responsible for planning, IT infrastructure, risk management, emergency management, public safety, and school administrators.

### Outline of the Training:

- 1. Introduction:** Overview of Cybersecurity COOP and its key importance for organizations.
- 2. Identifying Risks and Critical Functions by Department:**
  - **Activity:** Identify and prioritize essential services by department, both municipal and school-related, that must continue during a cybersecurity incident (e.g., public safety, utilities, education services).
  - Understand dependencies, including IT infrastructure, third-party services, and neighboring communities.
- 3. Cybersecurity Threats and Resilience Strategies:**
  - Overview of common cybersecurity threats facing municipalities and schools (e.g., ransomware, data breaches).
  - Best practices for building resilience: backups, regular updates, and employee training.
- 4. Incident Response Essentials:**
  - Internal and external communication protocols during incidents.
  - **Discussion Prompt:** How would your municipality or school communicate with the public during an incident?
- 5. Collaboration and Next Steps:**
  - How municipalities and schools can collaborate and share resources for enhanced resilience.
  - Key action items for participants to start developing their COOP.
