Cybersecurity Tips for Teachers



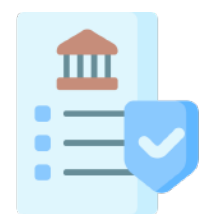
Do not share passwords with students or colleagues.



Do not leave your unlocked computer unattended.

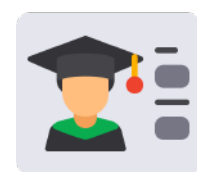


Only use approved software, apps, and plugins — Unapproved software, even those intended for instructional purposes, can put student data at risk.



Know your school's policies
Understand your school's security policies, including those for personal devices and data handling.

Safeguard Student Data



Protect Student Data

- Do not store student data (including IEPs, 504s, and medical info) in your email or on your desktop.
- Keeping sensitive data in email history can increase the severity of a breach.



Use Secure Messaging

- Avoid using personal messaging apps (like Google Chat, iMessage, and social media) for sensitive student information.



Secure Your Devices

- Avoid saving passwords in your browser.
- Do not store student data on personal devices.
- Protect students by not reusing passwords across different logins.
